1. It is easy to become flustered when criticized, and not focus on the truth.
2. Stay calm using the power of prayer, thankfulness and trust.
3. Be prepared mentally and spiritually.
4. Care about who you are talking to.
5. Know who you are.
6. Speak with the greatest respect and honor.
7. Seek counsel, prayer and help during times of difficulty.
8. Be prepared to endure hardship

8. What stands out most to you in this passage?
